Genesee Park: The dream started in 1912 when Denver voters approved a Mountain Parks Charter Amendment. The



following year land acquisitions resulted in approximately 2,4000 acres being set aside as Genesee Park. On 8/27/1913 Denver held an official opening ceremony for its first 2 mountain parks: Genesee and Lookout Mountain. In 1914 a mountain road opened, allowing drivers to drive up Genessee to the Game preserves located on its western side. In 1914 the bison here was established on the west side. The CCC build Chief Hosa Lodge & Campground and Genesee Mountain Camp, and picnic areas in the 1930's. Improvements have continued through out the

years; improving bison areas, building a tunnel under I-70 for them to move to other parts of the park, and adding in 2025 a 120-ft bridge & path to view the bison herd; building fitness areas, bike paths, hiking trails. It is the gem of The Denver Mountain Park system!!
