History is what we hold dear! See you there!!!



Future Field Trips: We are in the process of scheduling upcoming field trips. Due to the governmental / political flux it is difficult! Most historic places rely on outside funding, which is uncertain currently – thus affecting tours/visitors. I will let you know asap on future trips!!



Cathedral Basilica of the Immaculate Conception: Construction of the church at Colfax and Logan was 1902 – 1911. During construction the West tower was struck by lightning and repaired. [In June 1997 the East tower was struck by lightning and repaired.] The cathedral is in the French Gothic style made from Indiana limestone & granite from Gunnison, at a cost of \$500,00. The altar area including statuary, chair and rails are made of Carrara marble from Italy. The church interior area is made of Yule marble from Marble. It's 75 stained-glass windows contain more than 20,000 pieces of stained glass, are from the Royal Bavarian Art Institute in Munich, Germany. The windows

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cost \$34,000. Today one window will cost \$500,000! The cathedral has the most leaded stained glass of any church in North America. The floor is made of crushed Pearl shells, from the Elbe River, mixed with other products to harden to be a water and fireproof floor.
