Red Rocks: The area SW of Denver [about 10 miles] was named by early settlers as "Garden of Angels" bordered by 2 sandstone monoliths named "Ship Rock" and "Creation Rock." It was held privately from 1872 to 1927. In 1927 the City of Denver purchased the area for \$54,133, and promptly renamed it Red Rocks Amphitheatre. The building of the seating and other



areas began as a Civilian Conservation Corp and Work Progress Administration projects in 1936. The construction was completed and Red Rocks was formally dedicated June 15, 1941.

A new feature is being added: October Recipe: Easy Pulled Pork, from Sue Osborn, in a crock pot, place one cut up onion, one Pork Tenderloin [remove silver tendon section prior], season to taste, one 20 oz bottle of Dr. Pepper. Cook on low 6 hours. Drain and pull the pork into shreds [Editors note: use your kitchen mixer w/ beaters – shreds in seconds!]. Add your choice of BBQ sauce. Makes tender and flavorful sandwiches!!
